PUPPIES: Puppies under 6 months of age on the day of the show may not be entered for competition. However, entries "Not For Competition" can be accepted from any KC registered dog over 4 months of age on the day of the show. The registered name of the dog and its age must be included on the entry form.

CHILDREN: The committee reminds exhibitors bringing children to the show that they will be held responsible for their behaviour at all times & for any damage to property or equipment within the environs of the Showground caused by their children or children in their care.



SOFT CRATES

The Kennel Club has drawn attention to the health & safety implications concerning the use of soft crates at shows as in its view, they do not offer sufficient protection to dogs. Soft crates left unattended are a potential hazard, and it has been known for dogs to become distressed & move soft crates along the floor & also escape. They should only be used when there is sufficient room available & when they can be safely secured.

CAGES / CRATES

In accordance with new Kennel Club guidelines, Exhibitors must display exhibit number/owner identification on their crate, cage or container at all times.

!! Use of Electrical Equipment at Shows !!

The Kennel Club is becoming increasingly concerned at the amount of electrical equipment being used by exhibitors at shows, including hair dryers and hair straighteners and other grooming devices. Electrical equipment should not be brought to shows unless absolutely necessary. In rare instances where it might be required, it should be PAT tested and permission sought from the secretary of the show before it is used.

DEFINITION OF CLASSES

- 1. In the following definitions a Challenge Certificate includes any Show award that counts towards the title of Champion under the rules of any governing body recognised by the Kennel Club.
- 2. Wins at Championship Shows in Breed classes where Challenge Certificates are not on offer shall be counted as wins at Open Shows.
- 3. In the case of a dog owned in partnership and entered in Members' classes or competing for Members' Specials each partner must at the time of entry be a member of the Society.
- 4. In estimating the number of awards won all wins up to & including the seventh day before the date of closing of postal entries shall be counted when entering for any class ie. 31st July 2018.
- 5. Wins in Variety classes do not count for entry in Breed classes but when entering for Variety classes, wins in both Breed and Variety classes must be counted. A First prize does not include a Special prize of whatever value.
- 6. If an exhibitor reports before judging of a class or classes that a dog has been entered which is ineligible, the exhibitor may choose one of the following options:-

1. Withdrawal - the dog may be withdrawn from competition subject to the conditions of Regulations F (1) 9(j) & 20.

2. Transfer - a) If a dog is ineligible for a class or classes as regards its breed, colour, sex, weight or height the Show Secretary shall transfer it to the equivalent class or classes for the correct breed, colour, sex, weight or height and, in the event of there being no equivalent class, Minor Puppy & Puppy excepted to the Open class for the correct breed, colour, sex, weight or height. b) If an exhibit is entered incorrectly in a Minor Puppy class, Puppy class or Junior class, which is over age but under 12 calendar months, 18 calendar months of age or 24 calendar months respectively, the Show Secretary shall transfer the exhibit to the Puppy class, Junior class or Yearling class respectively for the correct breed, colour, sex, weight or height and in the event of there being no Puppy, Junior or Yearling, to the Open class for the correct breed, colour,

c) For any reason other than above, the Show Secretary shall transfer it to the Open class for the correct breed, colour, sex, weight or height.

7. If an exhibitor arrives late & misses a class, even if it is the only class in which the dog is entered, the dog may NOT be transferred to any other class.

PUPPY: For dogs of six and not exceeding twelve calendar months of age on the first day of the

sex, weight or height.

JUNIOR: For dogs of six and not exceeding eighteen calendar months of age on the first

day of the Show.

For dogs of twelve and not exceeding twenty four calendar months of age on YEARLING:

the first day of the Show.

MAIDEN: For dogs which have not won a Challenge Certificate or a First prize at an Open

or Championship Show (Minor Puppy, Special Minor Puppy, Puppy & Special

Puppy excepted whether restricted or not).

NOVICE: For dogs which have not won a Challenge Certificate or three or more First prizes

at Open or Championship Shows (Puppy, Special Puppy, Minor Puppy & Special

Minor Puppy Classes excepted whether restricted or not).

GRADUATE: For dogs which have not won a Challenge Certificate or four or more First prizes

at Championship Shows in Graduate, Post Graduate, Minor Limit, Mid Limit, Limit or Open Classes, whether restricted or not, at Shows where Challenge Certificates

were offered for the breed.

LIMIT: For dogs which have not become Show Champions under Kennel Club Regulations or under the rules of any governing body recognised by the Club or won 3 or more CC/

CACIB/CAC/Green Stars or won seven or more first prizes in all at Championship Shows in Limit or Open classes, confined to the Breed, whether restricted or not at Shows

where Challenge Certificates were offered for the breed.

OPEN: For all dogs of the Breed for which the class is provided and eligible for entry at this

For dogs of not less than seven years of age and over on the day of the Show. **VETERAN:** For two exhibits (either sex or mixed) of one breed belonging to the same exhibitor, BRACE:

each having been entered in some other class than Brace or Team.

SPEC BEGINNERS: For dog, owner or handler never to have won a Challenge Certificate or a Reserve

Challenge Certificate.

NOT FOR COMPETITION: Societies may at their discretion, accept Not for Competition entries. Societies

may accept such entries from breeds of dog not included within the title of the Society and at Shows held over more than one day, such entries may be accepted on any day

from any breed.

SPOT LIGHT ON THE JUDGE MAUD HAWKES

I was first introduced to the SCWT breed back home in Sweden in the early 1970s. Those dogs made such an impression that I planned to introduce one into my household, but this was not to be due to serious health issues in those early imports. My interest in, and fondness for

the Wheaten has however remained and I have over many years attended seminars featuring the breed. It has, for me as an Animal scientist, been especially impressive to follow the progressive and successful health work and the increase in numbers into a sustainable population. Credit must go to very dedicated breeders!

My first judging appointment for Wheatens was in1998 and I have since had the privilege of judging them quite regularly. I also judge a number of other breeds and award CCs for Cairn and Skye Terriers, here and abroad. I am honoured by the invitation to judge at this forthcoming Breed Club show and very much looking forward to being in the ring surrounded by lovely, happy Wheatens again.

VENUE

RIPON RACECOURSE is situated approx. 5 miles from the A1(M).

FROM THE SOUTH (A1(M)) Junction 48 Boroughbridge travel north on the A168, after 2 miles turn left onto the B6265 signposted Ripon. After approximately three miles you approach a narrow bridge. Once over the bridge you will be approaching the Racecourse on your left. The first entrance is for Caravans and the second entrance for cars.

FROM THE NORTH (A1(M)) Junction 49 Thirsk travel south on the A168. NB. The A168 runs parallel to the A1(M) and after about a two miles turn right on to the B6265 signposted Ripon. After approximately three miles you approach a narrow bridge. Once over the bridge you will be approaching the Racecourse on your left. The first entrance is for Caravans and the second entrance for cars.

RULES & REGULATIONS

- 1. OPENING OF SHOW: The Show will open at 07.30am
- ARRIVAL OF DOGS: Dogs will be received at any time, but it is the exhibitors' responsibility to ensure that exhibits are available for judging when required.
- 3. JUDGING TIME: Judging will not commence before 12.00 noon.
- REMOVAL OF DOGS: Exhibits may be removed from the Show after their judging has been completed.
 The Show will close half an hour after all judging has been completed.
- ENTRY FEES: First entry £5.00 Per Dog (members); £6.00 (non-members). Subsequent Classes with same dog 50p. Brace counts as a single entry. Dogs entered NFC £1.00 per dog (Details of NFC dogs are required on the entry form)
- 6. PRIZE MONEY: There is no prize money on offer at this Show
- 7. REFUSAL OF ENTRIES: The Committee reserves to itself the right to refuse entries.
- PUPPIES: Puppies under six calendar months of age on the first day of the Show are not eligible for exhibition.
- 9. MATING OF BITCHES: The mating of bitches within the precincts of the Show is forbidden.
- 10. BEST PUPPY IN SHOW: Where a Best Puppy in Show is scheduled the Best Puppy in Show is a puppy which has competed & is unbeaten by any other puppy exhibited at the same Show. A puppy is a dog of six & not exceeding twelve calendar months of age on the first day of the Show. Where the Best in Show is a puppy it should automatically be awarded Best Puppy in Show respectively. Where the Reserve Best in Show is a puppy which has only been beaten by an adult dog it will also automatically be Best Puppy in Show respectively. Consequently, selection of Best Puppy in Show must follow the selection of Best in Show respectively. Best Puppy in Show must be selected from puppies which have been judged and which are unbeaten by any other puppy.
- 11. BEST IN SHOW: Best in Show must be selected from exhibits declared Best of Sex but only if they have received a first prize in a class at the same show. If a Reserve Best in Show is to be selected, the eligible dogs are those declared Best Opposite Sex and the Reserve Best of Sex to the exhibit declared Best in Show.
- 12. Exhibits will not be admitted to Best in Show competition after a period of 10 minutes has elapsed since the announcement that exhibits are required for judging, unless they have been unavoidably delayed by previous judging not being completed on time, and then only with the special permission of the Show Management.
- 14. Exhibitors must not pick up dogs by their tails and leads when lifting them. Nor handle a dog in a manner which causes its feet not to touch the ground when on the move. This is not acceptable. Exhibitors should note that such practice would constitute harsh handling and reports of such practice will be referred to the Committee under Kennel Club Show regulation F11.
- 15. OVERSEAS EXHIBITS: All dogs resident outside the UK must be issued with a Kennel Club Authority to Compete number before entry to the show/event can be made. All overseas entries without an Authority to Compete number will be returned to the exhibitor/competition.
- 16. DOGS IN VEHICLES ON HOT DAYS: Anyone whose dog is entered at a Kennel Club licensed event should take all reasonable steps to ensure the needs of their dog/s are met, and should not put a dog's health and welfare at risk by any action, default, omission or otherwise. Breach of Kennel Club Regulations in this respect may be referred to the Board for disciplinary action under the Kennel Club Rules & Regulations. The use of pinch collars, electronic shock collars or prong collars, is not permitted at any show licensed by the Kennel Club. This shall apply at the venue or in the precincts of the show
 - When travelling to a show please take a moment to consider whether the route to the show is on a busy holiday route, and leave earlier to avoid increased time in traffic jams.
 - If your vehicle is not air-conditioned seriously consider whether travelling to the show is a good idea at all.
 - The vehicle should be as fully ventilated as possible, and plenty of stops should be taken, with lots of water available to drink.
 - Ensure your dog is not sitting in full sunlight. There should be plenty of free flowing air around the dog.
 - When at the show, never leave your dog in the vehicle.

Rules & Regs Cont:

- Keep the dog in the shade take your own shade, for example a large umbrella and always have plenty of water available to drink so your dog stays well hydrated.
- Avoid your dog taking part in unnecessary exertion, or from standing in exposed sunlight for extended lengths of time.
- Remember, if you feel hot your dog is very likely to feel much hotter and dehydrated, and this could lead to dire results. Please look after your dog's welfare.

WARNING: IF YOUR DOG IS FOUND TO BE AT RISK FORCIBLE ENTRY TO YOUR VEHICLE MAY BE NECESSARY WITHOUT LIABILITY FOR ANY DAMAGE CAUSED.

- 17. NOT FOR COMPETITION: Not for Competition entries will be accepted. Details of each dog so entered must be recorded on the entry form and must be Kennel Club registered.
- 18. No modification will be made to the schedule except by permission of the Board of the Kennel Club, which will be followed by advertisement in the canine press wherever possible,

IMPORTANT ANNOUNCEMENT RE CAR PARKING

This year, the Soft-Coated Wheaten Terrier Club's Open Show North will be held in conjunction with Darlington Championship Dog Show, on the same day and at the same venue as their show.

Judging for our Club's Open Show will not start until after the completion of SCWT breed judging for Darlington Championship Show classes, and certainly not before 12 noon.

If you are entering the competition for both Darlington Championship Dog Show, as well as Club's Open Show North, please make sure you pay for your parking with your Darlington Show entry.

However, if you are only entering the Club's Open Show, and not entering Darlington, you will need to pay for Car Parking with your OPEN SHOW NORTH entry, and you will be sent a car park pass by us nearer the date. Please make sure you request this on your entry form when you enter the Club's Open Show.

Cost of parking will be $\underline{\textbf{£5.00}}$ using the Open Show entry form, but if you don't request this on the entry form and decide to pay on the day when you arrive, there will be a parking charge of $\underline{\textbf{£10.00}}$ to pay on entry.

The Kennel Club would like to remind exhibitors of the importance of filling out entry forms accurately. Exhibitors should -

- \sim always read the show schedule carefully & enter their dog only in the class for which it is eligible for.
- ~ double check the details given are correct as incorrect information could result in disqualification for an award or delay in sending out Challenge Certificates and other awards.

REGULATIONS FOR THE PREPARATION OF DOGS FOR EXHIBITION F (B)

- 1. These regulations must be observed when a dog is prepared for exhibition and/or exhibited at any Kennel Club Licensed event. Objections may be referred to the General Committee for disciplinary action under these show regulations and/or for disciplinary action under Kennel Club Rule A42.(a) Adog found to have been exhibited in breach of these regulations will automatically be disqualified from exhibition at the show and from any award gained there. (b) Unless the exhibitor provides a satisfactory explanation for the dog being exhibited in breach of these regulations, he/she may be subject to further penalties of either a fine or as listed under rule A42.
- 2. (a) No substance which alters the natural colour, texture or body of the coat may be present in the dog's coat for any purpose at any time during the show. No substance which alters the natural colour of any external part of the dog may be present on the dog for any purpose at any time during the show. (b) Any other substance (other than water) which may be used in the preparation of a dog for exhibition must not be allowed to remain in the coat or on any other part of the dog at the time of exhibition.
- No act or operation which alters the natural conformation of a dog or any part thereof may be performed except:

 (a) Operations certified to the satisfaction of the General Committee.
 (b) The removal of dewclaws of any breed (c) Operations to prevent breeding provided such operations are notified to the Kennel Club before neutered dogs are shown. Nor must anything be done calculated to in the opinion of the General Committee to deceive
- 4. The General Committee without previous notice may order an examination of any dog or dogs at any Show. Any examination thus ordered will be made by a person having executive authority who shall have a written directive from the Kennel Club in their possession. Samples may be taken for further examination & analysis.
- 5. An individual has the right to lodge an objection to a dog only if he/she is the owner or handler of a dog competing in the same breed or class. An objection may, however, be lodged by any official of the Show or by anyone so deputed by the Kennel Club. It will be the responsibility of the individual who lodges the objection or the official (as appropriate), to substantiate the grounds for the objection. The Kennel Club will substantiate the grounds for an objection made on its behalf.
- Any objection by an individual related to an infringement of these regulations must be made in writing to the Show Secretary at his/her office before the close of the Show & the individual must produce evidence of identity at the time of lodging the complaint.

The Officers & Committee of The Soft Coated Wheaten Club of Great Britain do not accept responsibility for any products advertised or sold by Stall Holders and/or Trade Stands at this Show. Exhibitors are reminded that products on sale by Trade Stands for the preparation & grooming of dogs may not meet the requirements for the Regulations for the Preparation of Dogs for Exhibition.

Children under the age of 11 are the responsibility of, and must be accompanied at all times by, a Parent or Guardian.
