

HOW TO FIND THE VENIE The Royal Court Hotel, Tamworth Road, Coventry.

From the Motorway- North (M1)

- Exit the M1 at Junction 21 onto the M69 and take the M6 North to Junction 3
- Exit onto the A444 towards Coventry. Follow the dual carriageway
- · Carry straight over the bridge and at the second roundabout turn right into Holbrook Way
- Turn left into Holbrook Lane and then turn right into Burnaby Road
- Continue through two traffic lights & turn right at roundabout onto Tamworth Road
- · Follow Tamworth Road past St Thomas Church, then turn right just after Sandpits Lane
- · Here you will find The Royal Court Hotel in Coventry

From the Motorway-South (M40)

- Exit the M40 at Junction 15 onto the A46 & turn left onto the A45 towards Birmingham

RULES & REGULATIONS

- 1. OPENING OF SHOW: The Show will open at 8.00 am.
- ARRIVAL OF DOGS: Dogs will be received at any time but it is the exhibitor's responsibility to ensure that exhibits are available for judging when required.
- 3. JUDGING TIME: Judging will commence at 9.00 am.
- 4. REMOVAL OF DOGS: Exhibits may be removed from the Show after their judging has been completed. The Show will close half an hour after all judging has been completed.
- 5. COOKING STOVES: The use of cooking stoves in the proximity of the tenting and benching areas is forbidden except as authorised by the Show Management.
- 6. ENTRY FEES: First entry £18.00 Per Dog (members); £20.00 (non-members). Special reduced entry for 4 dogs or more in same ownership who would have been entered at full rate £15.00 per dog. Subsequent classes with same dog £1.00 (EXCEPT STAKES CLASS). Brace counts as a single entry. Stakes class £2.00 per dog. Dogs entered NFC £1.00 (Details of NFC dogs are required on the entry form). Vintage classes FREE. JH classes £1.00, JH of the Year FREE.
- 7. PRIZE MONEY: The amount of prize money at this Show is £25 for the winner of Special Beginners Stakes
- 8. REFUSAL OF ENTRIES: The Committee reserves to itself the right to refuse entries.
- PUPPIES: Puppies under six calendar months of age on the first day of the Show are not eligible for exhibition.
- 10. BEST PUPPY IN SHOW: Where a Best Puppy in Show is scheduled the Best Puppy in Show is a puppy which has competed & is unbeaten by any other puppy exhibited at the same Show. A puppy is a dog of six & not exceeding twelve calendar months of age on the first day of the Show. Where the Best in Show is a puppy it should automatically be awarded Best Puppy in Show respectively. Where the Reserve Best in Show is a puppy which has only been beaten by an adult dog it will also automatically be Best Puppy in Show respectively. Consequently, selection of Best Puppy in Show must follow the selection of Best in Show respectively. Best Puppy in Show must be selected from puppies which have been judged and which are unbeaten by any other puppy.
- 11. BEST IN SHOW: Best in Show must be selected from exhibits declared Best of Sex but only if they have received a first prize in a class at the same show. If a Reserve Best in Show is to be selected, the eligible dogs are those declared Best Opposite Sex and the Reserve Best of Sex to the exhibit declared Best in Show.
- 12. Exhibits will not be admitted to Best in Show competition after a period of 10 minutes has elapsed since the announcement that exhibits are required for judging, unless they have been unavoidably delayed by previous judging not being completed on time, and then only with the special permission of the Show Management.
- 14. Exhibitors must not pick up dogs by their tails and leads when lifting them. Nor handle a dog in a manner which causes its feet not to touch the ground when on the move. This is not acceptable. Exhibitors should note that such practice would constitute harsh handling and reports of such practice will be referred to the Committee under Kennel Club Show regulation F11.
- 15. OVERSEAS EXHIBITS: All dogs resident outside the UK must be issued with a Kennel Club Authority to Compete number before entry to the show/event can be made. All overseas entries without an Authority to Compete number will be returned to the exhibitor/competition.
- 16. DOGS IN VEHICLES ON HOT DAYS: Anyone whose dog is entered at a Kennel Club licensed event should take all reasonable steps to ensure the needs of their dog/s are met, and should not put a dog's health and welfare at risk by any action, default, omission or otherwise. Breach of Kennel Club Regulations in this respect may be referred to the Board for disciplinary action under the Kennel Club Rules & Regulations. The use of pinch collars, electronic shock collars or prong collars, is not permitted at any show licensed by the Kennel Club. This shall apply at the venue or in the precincts of the show
 - When travelling to a show please take a moment to consider whether the route to the show is on a busy holiday route, and leave earlier to avoid increased time in traffic jams.
 - If your vehicle is not air-conditioned seriously consider whether travelling to the show is a
 good idea at all.
 - The vehicle should be as fully ventilated as possible, and plenty of stops should be taken, with lots of water available to drink.

- Ensure your dog is not sitting in full sunlight. There should be plenty of free flowing air around the dog.
- When at the show, never leave your dog in the vehicle.
- Keep the dog in the shade take your own shade, for example a large umbrella and always have plenty of water available to drink so your dog stays well hydrated.
- Avoid your dog taking part in unnecessary exertion, or from standing in exposed sunlight for extended lengths of time.
- Remember, if you feel hot your dog is very likely to feel much hotter and dehydrated, and this
 could lead to dire results. Please look after your dog's welfare.

WARNING: IF YOUR DOG IS FOUND TO BE AT RISK FORCIBLE ENTRY TO YOUR VEHICLE MAY BE NECESSARY WITHOUT LIABILITY FOR ANY DAMAGE CAUSED

- 17. Anyone whose dog is entered at a Kennel Club licensed should take all reasonable steps to ensure to ensure the needs of their dog(s) are met, and should not put a dog's health & welfare at risk by any actions, default, omissions or otherwise. Breach of Kennel Club Regulations in this this respect may be referred to the Board for disciplinary action under the Kennel Club Rules & Regulations. The use of pinch collars, electronic shock collars, or prong collars, is not permitted at any show licensed by the Kennel Club. This shall apply at the venue or within the precincts of the show
- 18. NOT FOR COMPETITION: Not for Competition entries will be accepted. Details of each dog so entered must be recorded on the entry form and must be Kennel Club registered.
- 19. No modification will be made to the schedule except by permission of the Board of the Kennel Club, which will be followed by advertisement in the canine press wherever possible,

PHOTOGRAPHY & VIDEO RIGHTS.

The Organisers would like to bring the regulation on photography, filming & live streaming to the attention of exhibitors, trade stands, press and visitors. It is a condition of all those attending the event that no filming or other form of recording may be taken or made at the venue without the express written permission of the organisers. The taking of photographs in the venue for sale or reward is strictly prohibited except with the written permission of the Organisers. Press accredited photographers are provided with permission to take photographs ONLY for the use in newspapers, magazines and internet sites - this is for news purposes only. There is no objection to the general public taking photographs or video film of general views of the show, provided these are for private use only. Specific dogs may be photographed only with the approval of the exhibitor.

No photography, filming or live streaming is permitted in breed judging rings whilst judging is actually taking place. However, judges may allow it to happen at the end of classes. Filming and flash photography is allowed from outside the rings at all times unless the

operation of the camera is actually affecting the exhibits. However, if a powerful flash unit is used or it is clear that exhibitors are being affected, a ring steward or judge is empowered to stop the person concerned. Cinematography or television equipment may only be used at the show if a permit has been issued by the Organisers.

SOFT CRATES

The Kennel Club has drawn attention to the potential health and safety implications concerning the use of soft crates at shows as in its view, they do not offer sufficient protection to dogs. Soft crates left unattended are a potential hazard, and it has been known for dogs to become distressed and move soft crates along the floor and also escape. Soft crates should only be used when there is sufficient room available and when they can be safely secured.

CAGES / CRATES

All cages/crates must be correctly and clearly labelled with exhibitors contact information or ring number.

PUPPIES

Puppies under 6 months of age on the day of the show may not be entered for competition. However entries not for competition can be accepted from any KC registered dog over the age of 4 months. The registered name of the dog and its age must be included on the entry form.

DOGS IN VEHICLES

Exhibitors are reminded that dogs must NOT be left in a vehicle in hot weather. It is considered that the act of causing suffering to a dog as a result of it being in a vehicle by an exhibitor or the owner of a registered dog on a hot day could be considered discreditable or prejudicial to the interests of the canine world and could form the basis of a case under Kennel Club Rule 42.

CHILDREN

The committee reminds exhibitors bringing children to the Show that they will be held responsible for their behaviour at all times & for any damage to property or equipment within the environs of the Showground caused by their children or children in their care.

DOG FOULING

Any owner, exhibitor, handler or other person in charge of a dog is requested to remove as soon as possible any fouling caused by their dog/s at any Kennel Club Licensed Show within the licensed venue & within the environs of that event including car & caravan parks & approaches. Adequate receptacles for the disposal of such fouling will be provided.



DEFINITION OF CLASSES

- 1. In the following definitions, a Challenge Certificate includes any Show award that counts towards the title of Champion under the Rules of any governing body recognised by the Kennel Club.
- 2. Wins at Championship Shows in breed classes where Challenge Certificates are not on offer shall be counted as wins at Open Shows.
- 3. In the case of a dog owned in partnership and entered in Members' classes or competing for Members' Specials each partner must at the time of entry be a member of the Society.
- 4. In estimating the number of awards won, all wins up to and including the seventh day before the date of closing of postal & on-line entries shall be counted when entering for any class i.e. 25th September 2018. Wins in Variety classes do not count for entry in Breed classes but when entering in Variety classes, wins in both Breed and Variety classes must be counted. A first prize does not include a Special Prize of whatever value.
- 5. If an exhibitor reports before the judging of a class or classes that a dog has been entered which is ineligible, the exhibitor may choose one of the following options:-
 - (1) Withdrawal: The dog may be withdrawn from competition subject to the conditions of Regulations 9(j) and 20.
 - (2) Transfer: a) If a dog is ineligible for a class or classes as regards its colour, sex, weight or height the Show Secretary shall transfer it to the equivalent class or classes for the correct colour, sex, weight or height and, in the event of there being no equivalent class, Minor Puppy and Puppy excepted to the Open class for the correct colour, sex, weight or height.
 - b) For an exhibit entered incorrectly in a Minor Puppy Class, Puppy Class or Junior Class, which is over age but under twelve calendar months of age, eighteen calendar months of age or 24 calendar months of age respectively, the Show Secretary shall transfer the exhibit to the Puppy Class, Junior Class or Yearling Class respectively for the correct colour, sex, weight or height and in the event of there being no Puppy, Junior or Yearling Class to the Open Class for the correct colour, sex, weight or height.
 - c) For any reason other than the above, the Show Secretary shall transfer the exhibit to the Open Class for the correct colour, sex, weight or height.
 - d) If an exhibit arrives late and misses a class, even if it is the only class in which the dog is entered, the dog may not be transferred to any other class.

MINOR PUPPY For dogs of six and not exceeding nine calendar months of age on the first day of

the Show.

PUPPY For dogs of six and not exceeding twelve calendar months of age on the first day of

the Show.

JUNIOR For dogs of six and not exceeding eighteen calendar months of age on the first day

of the Show.

NOVICE For dogs which have not won a Challenge Certificate or three or more First Prizes

at Open and Championship Shows (Minor Puppy, Special Minor Puppy, Puppy and

Special Puppy classes excepted, whether restricted or not).

GRADUATE For dogs which have not won a Challenge Certificate or four or more First Prizes

at Championship Shows in Graduate, Post Graduate, Minor Limit, Mid Limit, Limit and Open classes, whether restricted or not where Challenge Certificates were

offered for the breed.

POST GRADUATE For dogs which have not won a Challenge Certificate or five or more First Prizes

at Championship Shows in Post Graduate, Minor Limit, Mid Limit, Limit and Open classes, whether restricted or not where Challenge Certificates were offered for

the breed.

MID LIMIT Regulations or under the rules of any governing body recognised by the Club or

won 3 or more CC/CACIB/CAC/Green Starsor won five or more First Prizes in all at Championship Shows in Mid Limit, Limit or Open Classes confined to the breed,

whether restricted or not, at shows where Challenge

Certificates were offered for the breed.

LIMIT For dogs which have not become Show Champions under Kennel Club Regulations

or under the rules of any governing body recognised by the Club or won 3 or more CC/CACIB/CAC/Green Stars or won seven or more first prizes in all at Championship Shows in Limit or Open classes, confined to the Breed, whether restricted or not at

Shows where Challenge Certificates were offered for the breed.

Definition of Classes Contd.....

OPEN For all dogs of the breed for which the class is provided and eligible for entry at

the Show

PROGENY For a dog or bitch, accompanied by at least three of its registered progeny. The

dog or bitch not necessarily entered in another class however, all progeny having been entered and exhibited in another class. The dog or bitch and the

progeny need not be registered in the same ownership.

BRACE For two exhibits (either sex or mixed) of one breed belonging to the same

exhibitor, each exhibit having been entered in some class other than Brace or

Team.

SPECIAL MEMBERS CLASS As Open but must be fully paid up members of the SCWTC of GB and where a dog is owned in partnership all exhibitors should be members of the

SCWTC of GB. Dogs must have been entered in a previous class at the show to

be eligible.

SPECIAL YEARLING For dogs of six and not exceeding twenty four calendar months of age on the

first day of the Show.

SPECIAL VETERAN (7 - 9 years) For dogs of not less than SEVEN years of age and under TEN

on the day of the Show.

SPECIAL VINTAGE (10+ years) For dogs of not less than TEN years on the day of the Show.

SPECIAL BEGINNERS CLASS Open to any dog or bitch, the dog, owner or handler never to

have won a Challenge Certificate or a Reserve Challenge Certificate. Dogs must

have been entered in a previous class at the show to be eligible.

NOT FOR COMPETITION Societies may at their discretion, accept Not for Competition entries.

Societies may accept such entries from breeds of dog not included within the title of the Society and at Shows held over more than one day, such entries may

be accepted on any day from any breed.

!! Use of Electrical Equipment at Shows !!

The Kennel Club is becoming increasingly concerned at the amount of electrical equipment being used by exhibitors at shows, including hair dryers and hair straighteners and other grooming devices. Electrical equipment should not be brought to shows unless absolutely necessary. In rare instances where it might be required, it should be PAT tested and permission sought from the secretary of the show before it is used.

REGULATIONS FOR THE PREPARATION OF DOGS FOR EXHIBITION F (B)

- 1. These regulations must be observed when a dog is prepared for exhibition and/or exhibited at any Kennel Club Licensed event. Objections may be referred to the General Committee for disciplinary action under these show regulations and/or for disciplinary action under Kennel Club Rule A42.(a) A dog found to have been exhibited in breach of these regulations will automatically be disqualified from exhibition at the show and from any award gained there. (b) Unless the exhibitor provides a satisfactory explanation for the dog being exhibited in breach of these regulations, he/she may be subject to further penalties of either a fine or as listed under rule A42.
- 2. (a) No substance which alters the natural colour, texture or body of the coat may be present in the dog's coat for any purpose at any time during the show. No substance which alters the natural colour of any external part of the dog may be present on the dog for any purpose at any time during the show. (b) Any other substance (other than water) which may be used in the preparation of a dog for exhibition must not be allowed to remain in the coat or on any other part of the dog at the time of exhibition.
- No act or operation which alters the natural conformation of a dog or any part thereof may be performed except:
 (a) Operations certified to the satisfaction of the General Committee.
 (b) The removal of dewclaws of any breed (c) Operations to prevent breeding provided such operations are potified to the Kenne

of any breed (c) Operations to prevent breeding provided such operations are notified to the Kennel Club before neutered dogs are shown. Nor must anything be done calculated to in the opinion of the General Committee to deceive.

- 4. The General Committee without previous notice may order an examination of any dog or dogs at any Show. Any examination thus ordered will be made by a person having executive authority who shall have a written directive from the Kennel Club in their possession. Samples may be taken for further examination & analysis.
- 5. An individual has the right to lodge an objection to a dog only if he/she is the owner or handler of a dog competing in the same breed or class. An objection may, however, be lodged by any official of the Show or by anyone so deputed by the Kennel Club. It will be the responsibility of the individual who lodges the objection or the official (as appropriate), to substantiate the grounds for the objection. The Kennel Club will substantiate the grounds for an objection made on its behalf.
- 6. Any objection by an individual related to an infringement of these regulations must be made in writing to the Show Secretary at his/her office before the close of the Show & the individual must produce evidence of identity at the time of lodging the complaint.
