DOGS IN VEHICLES ON HOT DAYS

Your dog is vulnerable and AT RISK if left in a vehicle in high temperatures and even on days considered as slightly warm. Please take care of your dog. If your dog is found to be at risk forcible entry to your vehicle may be necessary without liability for any damage caused.



CHILDREN: The Committee reminds exhibitors bringing children to the show that they will be held responsible for their behaviour at all times and for any damage to property or equipment within the environs of the Showground caused by their children or children in their care.

PUPPIES: Puppies under 6 months of age on the day of the show may not be entered for competition. However, dogs over 4 months of age on the day of the show from any KC registered dog may be entered "NOT FOR COMPETITION".

PLEASE NOTE:

It is the exhibitor's responsibility to be at their class for judging.

SALE OF GOODS: Sale of goods other than those on the Club Bookstall must be cleared with the Committee beforehand.

SOFT CRATES: The Kennel Club has drawn attention to the health & safety implications concerning the use of soft crates at shows as in its view, they do not offer sufficient protection to dogs. Soft crates left unattended are a potential hazard, and it has been known for dogs to become distressed & move soft crates along the floor & also escape. They should only be used when there is sufficient room available and when they can be safely secured.

Health and Safety:

A nominated Safety Officer will be in attendance throughout the show. Exhibitors and spectators are reminded that just as The Soft Coated Wheaten Terrier Club of GB has a responsibility to ensure the health and safety of all those attending their event, all those present have a duty and responsibility for their own safety. They are therefore expected to take the greatest care to avoid guy ropes, uneven surfaces and other hazards which are inevitable and integral elements of a dog show. Those bringing and using portable items of equipment such as folding chairs, trolleys, cages and grooming tables also have a responsibility to ensure that their tools, equipment and furniture is used and erected safely and does not constitute a hazard to others. Exhibitors are also reminded that they should wear appropriate clothing and footwear for the prevailing conditions on the site. Exhibitors show at their own risk and if they consider conditions are not ideal or are unsafe they may withdraw their dog/s from classes.

- Puppies under six calendar months of age on the first day of the show are not eligible for exhibition.

 The mating of bitches within the precincts of the show is forbidden.

 Best Puppy in Show Where a Best puppy in Show competition is scheduled the Best Puppy in Show is a puppy which has competed and is unbeaten by any other puppy at the same show. A Puppy is a dog of six and not exceeding twelve calendar months of age on the first day of the Show. Where the Best in Show is a puppy it may at the discretion of the judge be awarded Best Puppy in Show respectively. Similarly, if the Reserve Best in Show is a puppy which has only been beautiful that it may at the discretion of the puppy in Show respectively. been beaten by an adult dog it may at the discretion of the judge be awarded Best Puppy in Show respectively.
- Consequently, selection of Best Puppy in Show must follow the selection of Best in Show respectively.

 Best in Show Best in Show must be selected from the exhibits declared Best of Sex. If a Reserve Best in Show is to be selected, the eligible dogs are those declared Best Opposite Sex and the Reserve Best of Sex to the exhibit declared Best Opposite Sex and the Reserve Best of Sex to the exhibit declared Best in Show.
- Exhibits will not be admitted to Best in Show competition after a period of ten minutes has elapsed since the announcement that exhibits are required for judging, unless they have been unavoidably delayed by previous judging not being completed on time, and then only with permission of the Show Management.
- Exhibitors must not pick up dogs by their tails and leads when lifting them nor handle a dog in a manner which causes its feet not to touch the ground when on the move. This is not acceptable. Exhibitors should note that such practice would constitute harsh handling and reports of such practice will be referred to the Committee under Kennel Club Show Regulations F11.

- 15. All dogs resident outside the UK must be issued with a Kennel Club Authority to Compete number before entry to the show/event can be made. All overseas entries without an Authority to Compete number will be returned to the exhibitor/
- DOGS IN VEHICLES ON HOT DAYS.  - Your dog is vulnerable and at risk during hot weather and the Kennel Club offers the following guidance to help guide you through the do's and don'ts travelling to and whilst at KC licenced events.
 - When travelling to a show please take a moment to consider whether the route to the show is on a busy holiday route, and leave earlier to avoid increased time in traffic jams.
 - If your vehicle is not air-conditioned seriously consider whether travelling to the show is a good idea at all.
 - The vehicle should be as fully ventilated as possible, and plenty of stops should be taken, with lots of water available to
 - Ensure your dog is not sitting in full sunlight. There should be plenty of free flowing air around the dog. When at the show, never leave your dog in the vehicle.
 - Keep the dog in the shade take your own shade for example a large umbrella and always have plenty of water available to drink so your dog stays well hydrated.
 - Avoid your dog taking part in unnecessary exertion, or from standing in exposed sunlight for extended lengths of time. Remember, if you feel hot your dog is very likely to feel much hotter and dehydrated, and this could lead to dire
 - results. Please look after your dog's welfare.
