

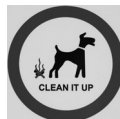
## ~ IMPORTANT NOTICES ~



**FOULING - FOULING MUST BE CLEANED UP ANYWHERE IN THE VENUE, INCLUDING THE CAR PARK AND GRASS AREA.**



**EXERCISE AREA:** An exercise area is provided and it is the responsibility of the Exhibitors/Handlers to clean up any fouling caused by dogs in their charge. Equipment is provided for the purpose and your cooperation would be appreciated.



### DOGS IN VEHICLES ON HOT DAYS

Your dog is vulnerable and AT RISK if left in a vehicle in high temperatures and even on days considered as slightly warm. Please take care of your dog. If your dog is found to be at risk forcible entry to your vehicle may be necessary without liability for any damage caused.



**CHILDREN:** The Committee reminds exhibitors bringing children to the show that they will be held responsible for their behaviour at all times and for any damage to property or equipment within the environs of the Showground caused by their children or children in their care.



**PUPPIES:** Puppies under 6 months of age on the day of the show may not be entered for competition. However, dogs over 4 months of age on the day of the show from any KC registered dog may be entered "NOT FOR COMPETITION".



### PLEASE NOTE:

It is the exhibitor's responsibility to be at their class for judging.

**SALE OF GOODS:** Sale of goods other than those on the Club Bookstall must be cleared with the Committee beforehand.

**SOFT CRATES:** The Kennel Club has drawn attention to the health & safety implications concerning the use of soft crates at shows as in its view, they do not offer sufficient protection to dogs. Soft crates left unattended are a potential hazard, and it has been known for dogs to become distressed & move soft crates along the floor & also escape. They should only be used when there is sufficient room available and when they can be safely secured.

## Health and Safety:

A nominated Safety Officer will be in attendance throughout the show. Exhibitors and spectators are reminded that just as **The Soft Coated Wheaten Club** has a responsibility to ensure the health and safety of all those attending their event, all those present have a duty and responsibility for their own safety. They are therefore expected to take the greatest care to avoid guy ropes, uneven surfaces and other hazards which are inevitable and integral elements of a dog show. Those bringing and using portable items of equipment such as folding chairs, trolleys, cages and grooming tables also have a responsibility to ensure that their tools, equipment and furniture is used and erected safely and does not constitute a hazard to others. Exhibitors are also reminded that they should wear appropriate clothing and footwear for the prevailing conditions on the site. Exhibitors show at their own risk and if they consider conditions are not ideal or are unsafe they may withdraw their dog/s from classes.

## DIRECTIONS TO VENUE Worsall Village Hall

From the North A66: Coming from Middlesbrough A66 take the slip road to Stockton (West)/Yarm. Take 1st exit at the roundabout onto Yarm Road A153 heading towards Yarm. Carry straight over at the next roundabout towards Yarm A153. Go through Yarm High Street onto A67 then turn right onto Worsall Road B1265. Then turn right onto B1264. Continue on B1264 and turn right onto Village Road. Turn immediate left onto Church Lane and Hall is on your right.

From the South A19: Coming from the South A19 take exit signposted Yarm A67. At the roundabout take the first exit onto Green Lane B1264 towards Worsall. Continue on B1264 and then turn right onto Village Road and then immediate left onto Church Lane and the Hall is on your left.

## SPOT LIGHT ON THE JUDGE - KEN BARTLETT

I have been involved with dogs all my life, having bred and shown West Highland White Terrier's (this led me to being a committee member and Chairman for many years) and also of Sealyham Terrier's. I also had Cocker Spaniels of which I was Chairman of that club for many years, I have been passed by the KC to award CCs in 20 Terrier breeds plus the group at Ch. level, also do 4 breeds in the Toy group and also 1 in the pastoral group.



My interest in Soft Coated Wheaten's has extended for many years and it has taken a long time to reach this position. You will have often seen me sitting and watching the breed at Ch. shows. I am very pleased and honoured to be invited to judge your open show, many thanks for the invitation.

## RULES AND REGULATIONS

1. The show will open at 9.30 a.m.
2. Dogs will be received at any time but it is the exhibitor's responsibility to ensure that dogs are available for judging when required.
3. **Judging will commence at 10.30 a.m.**
4. Exhibits may be removed from the Show after their judging has been completed. The Show will close half an hour after all judging has been completed.
5. **ENTRY FEES** : Members 1st Entry - £6.00 per dog. Non-members 1st Entry - £7.00 per dog. Subsequent entries £1.00 per class. Not for Competition - £1.00 per dog. Junior Handling £1.00. Catalogues £2.00 (pre-paid) (£2.50 on the day) Prize Money - There is no prize money at this show.
6. The Committee reserves to itself the right to refuse entries.
7. Puppies under six calendar months of age on the first day of the show are not eligible for exhibition.
8. The mating of bitches within the precincts of the show is forbidden.
9. **Best Puppy in Show** Where a Best puppy in Show competition is scheduled the Best Puppy in Show is a puppy which has competed and received a first prize in a class as the same show. A Puppy is a dog of six and not exceeding twelve calendar months of age on the first day of the Show. Where the Best in Show is a puppy it may, at the discretion of the judge be awarded Best Puppy in Show respectively. Similarly, if the Reserve Best in Show is a puppy which has only been beaten by an adult dog it may, at the discretion of the judge be Best Puppy in Show respectively. Consequently, selection of Best Puppy in Show must follow the selection of Best in Show respectively.
10. **Best in Show** Best in Show must be selected from the exhibits declared Best of Sex but only if they have received a first prize in a class at the same show. If a Reserve Best in Show is to be selected, the eligible dogs are those declared Best Opposite Sex and the Reserve Best of Sex to the exhibit declared Best in Show. The dogs declared Best in Show and Reserve Best in Show must not compete in any subsequent competition.
11. Exhibits will not be admitted to Best in Show competition after a period of ten minutes has elapsed since the announcement that exhibits are required for judging, unless they have been unavoidably delayed by previous judging not being completed on time, and then only with permission of the Show Management.
12. Exhibitors must not pick up dogs by their tails and leads when lifting them nor handle a dog in a manner which causes its feet not to touch the ground when on the move. This is not acceptable. Exhibitors should note that such practice would constitute harsh handling and reports of such practice will be referred to the Committee under Kennel Club Show Regulations F11.
13. All exhibitors must be familiar with Kennel Club Regulation F (Annex B) - Regulations for the Preparation of Dogs for Exhibition.
14. All dogs resident outside the UK must be issued with a Kennel Club Authority to Compete number before entry to the show/event can be made. All overseas entries without an Authority to Compete number will be returned to the exhibitor/competitor.
15. **DOGS IN VEHICLES ON HOT DAYS.** Anyone whose dog is entered at a Kennel Club licensed event should take all reasonable steps to ensure the needs of their dog(s) are met, and should not put a dog's health and welfare at risk by any action, default, omission or otherwise. Breach of Kennel Club Regulations in this respect may be referred to the General Committee for action under Kennel Club Rules and Regulations.  
Your dog is vulnerable and at risk during hot weather and the Kennel Club offers the following guidance to help guide you through the do's and don'ts travelling to and whilst at KC licenced events.  
When travelling to a show please take a moment to consider whether the route to the show is on a busy holiday route, and leave earlier to avoid increased time in traffic jams.  
If your vehicle is not air-conditioned seriously consider whether travelling to the show is a good idea at all.  
The vehicle should be as fully ventilated as possible, and plenty of stops should be taken, with lots of water available to drink.  
Ensure your dog is not sitting in full sunlight. There should be plenty of free flowing air around the dog.  
When at the show, never leave your dog in the vehicle.  
Keep the dog in the shade – take your own shade for example a large umbrella and always have plenty of water available to drink so your dog stays well hydrated.  
Avoid your dog taking part in unnecessary exertion, or from standing in exposed sunlight for extended lengths of time.  
Remember, if you feel hot your dog is very likely to feel much hotter and dehydrated, and this could lead to dire results. Please look after your dog's welfare.  
**WARNING: IF YOUR DOG IS FOUND TO BE AT RISK FORCIBLE ENTRY TO YOUR VEHICLE MAY BE NECESSARY WITHOUT LIABILITY FOR ANY DAMAGE CAUSED.**
16. Anyone whose dog is entered at a Kennel Club licensed event should take all reasonable steps to ensure the needs of their dog(s) are met, and should not put a dog's health and welfare at risk by any action, default omission or otherwise. Breach of Kennel Club Regulations in this respect may be referred to the Board for disciplinary action under the Kennel club Rules and Regulations. The use of pinch collars, electronic shock collars, or prong collars, is not permitted at any show licensed by the Kennel Club. This shall apply at the venue or within the precincts of the show.
17. Not for competition entries will be accepted. Details of each dog so entered must be recorded on the entry form and must be Kennel Club registered.
18. No modifications will be made to this schedule except by permission of the Board of the Kennel Club, which will be followed by advertisement in the Canine Press wherever possible.

20. Dog Fouling and Grooming: Any owner exhibitor handler or person in charge of a dog is required to remove, as soon as possible, any fouling caused by their dog(s) at any Kennel Club licensed show within the licensed venue and within the environs of that event, including car parks and approaches. Any organization holding a Kennel Club Licensed event is required to provide an adequate number of receptacles for the disposal of such fouling.
21. Exhibitors passes will not be sent out. Please send a SAE. If you wish for acknowledgement of entries.
22. Responsibility. The Committee will not be responsible for the loss, detention of, or damage to any dog or other property whether arising from accident, or other cause whatever, or from any act of omission of itself, its officers, agents, servants or other, or damage done by the exhibitors to any person or property.

### SECURITY AT SHOWS

In light of recent events the Kennel Club would like to issue a reminder to all societies of the importance of security at dog shows. The Kennel Club understand that due to the nature of dog shows and the quantity of paraphernalia exhibitors bring, it would be extremely difficult for show organisers to take on the issue of security alone, therefore we would re-iterate the advice being given by the Police and security services, that everyone in the UK should remain vigilant and this applies to those organising and taking part in dog shows.

The importance of exhibitors feeling that they and their dogs are safe when attending a show cannot be underestimated. We would therefore remind you of the importance of the need for show organisers and exhibitors to remain mindful of potential dangers and that all visitors to shows generally need to be vigilant and alert. Furthermore the society provide robust notification informing exhibitors of where to report to should they see anything suspicious or of concern, and the evacuation procedures in place.

In view of the above, should you see anything suspicious or of concern, please alert the Show Manager, and/or the Show Secretary immediately. If it is a package or bag you are concerned about, please do NOT attempt to move it or examine it yourself.

Should it be necessary for the hall to be evacuated, please remember that evacuation should be carried out as speedily but as safely as possible, as in the case of a fire. It is important that you do not block the exit routes with cages or bags. Please follow any instructions given to you by the Show Management regarding evacuation procedures.
