DOGS IN VEHICLES ON HOT DAYS

Your dog is vulnerable and AT RISK if left in a vehicle in high temperatures and even on days considered as slightly warm. Please take care of your dog. If your dog is found to be at risk forcible entry to your vehicle may be necessary without liability for any damage caused.



CHILDREN: The Committee reminds exhibitors bringing children to the show that they will be held responsible for their behaviour at all times and for any damage to property or equipment within the environs of the Showground caused by their children or children in their care.

PUPPIES: Puppies under 6 months of age on the day of the show may not be entered for competition. However, dogs over 4 months of age on the day of the show from any KC registered dog may be entered "NOT FOR COMPETITION".



PLEASE NOTE:

It is the exhibitor's responsibility to be at their class for judging.

SALE OF GOODS: Sale of goods other than those on the Club Bookstall must be cleared with the Committee beforehand.

SOFT CRATES: The Kennel Club has drawn attention to the health & safety implications concerning the use of soft crates at shows as in its view, they do not offer sufficient protection to dogs. Soft crates left unattended are a potential hazard, and it has been known for dogs to become distressed & move soft crates along the floor & also escape. They should only be used when there is sufficient room available and when they can be safely secured.



PHOTOGRAPHY & VIDEO RIGHTS

The Organisers would like to bring the regulation on photography, filming & live streaming to the attention of exhibitors, trade stands, press and visitors. It is a condition of all those attending the event that no filming or other form or recording may be taken or made at the venue without the express written permission of the organisers. The taking of photographs in the venue for sale or reward is strictly prohibited except with the written permission of the Organisers. Press accredited photographers are provided with permission to take photographs ONLY for the use in newspapers, magazines and internet sites—this is for news purposes only. There is no objection to the general public taking photographs or video film of general views of the show, provided these are for private use only. Specific dogs may be photographed only with the approval of the exhibitor.

No photography, filming or live streaming is permitted in breed judging rings whilst judging is actually taking place. However, judges may allow it to happen at the end of the classes. Filming and flash photography is allowed from outside the rings at all times unless the operation of the camera is actually affecting the exhibits. However, if a powerful flash unit is used or it is clear that exhibitors are being affected a ring steward or judge is empowered to stop the person concerned. Cinematography or television equipment may only be used at the show if a permit has been issued by the Organisers.

Health and Safety:

A nominated Safety Officer will be in attendance throughout the show. Exhibitors and spectators are reminded that just as **The Soft Coated Wheaten Terrier Club of GB** has a responsibility to ensure the health and safety of all those attending their event, all those present have a duty and responsibility for their own safety. They are therefore expected to take the greatest care to avoid guy ropes, uneven surfaces and other hazards which are inevitable and integral elements of a dog show. Those bringing and using portable items of equipment such as folding chairs, trolleys, cages and grooming tables also have a responsibility to ensure that their tools, equipment and furniture is used and erected safely and does not constitute a hazard to others. Exhibitors are also reminded that they should wear appropriate clothing and footwear for the prevailing conditions on the site. Exhibitors show at their own risk and if they consider conditions are not ideal or are unsafe they may withdraw their dog/s from classes.

DEFINITIONS OF CLASSES

(The word DOG includes both sexes)

In the following definitions, a Challenge Certificate includes any Show award that counts towards the title of Champion under the Rules of any governing body recognised by the Kennel Club.

Wins at Championship Shows in breed classes where Challenge Certificates are not on offer shall be counted as wins at Open Shows.

In the case of a dog owned in partnership and entered in Members' classes or competing for Members' Specials each partner must at the time of entry be a member of the Society.

In estimating the number of awards won, all wins up to and including the seventh day before the date of closing of postal entries shall be counted when entering for any class i.e.: **Saturday 17th September, 2022.**

Wins in Variety classes do not count for entry in Breed classes but when entering for Variety classes, wins in both Breed and Variety classes must be counted. First prizes awarded in any classes defined as Special do not count towards eligibility.

If an exhibitor reports before the judging of a class or classes that a dog has been entered which is ineligible, the exhibitor may choose one of the following options:-

(1) WITHDRAWAL: The dog may be withdrawn from competition subject to the conditions of Regulation F.(1). 19

(2) **TRANSFER:** a) If a dog is ineligible for a class or classes as regards its colour, sex, weight or height the Show Secretary shall transfer it to the equivalent class or classes for the correct colour, sex, weight or height and, in the event of there being no equivalent class, Minor Puppy and Puppy excepted to the Open class for the correct colour, sex, weight or height.

b) If an exhibit is entered incorrectly in a Minor Puppy Class. Puppy Class or Junior Class. which is over

age but under 12 calendar months of age, 18 calendar months of age or 24 calendar months of age respectively the show secretary shall transfer the exhibit to the Puppy Class, Junior Class, or Yearling Class respectively for the correct colour, sex, weight or height and in the event of there being no Puppy, Junior or Yearling Class to the Open Class for the correct colour, sex, weight or height and in the event of these being no Puppy, Junior or Yearling Class to the Open Class for the correct colour, sex, weight or height to puppy.

c) For any reason other than the above, the Show Secretary shall transfer it to the Open class for the correct colour, sex, weight or height

d) If an exhibit arrives late and misses a class, even if it is the only class in which the dog is entered, the dog may not be transferred to any other class.

For dogs of six and not exceeding nine calendar months of age on the first day of the Show.
For dogs of six and not exceeding twelve calendar months of age on the first day of the Show.
For dogs of six and not exceeding eighteen calendar months of age on the first day of the Show.
For dogs of six and not exceeding eighteen calendar months of age on the first day of the Show.
For dogs of six and not exceeding twenty-four calendar months of age on the first day of the Show.

NOVICE For dogs which have not won a Challenge Certificate/CACIB/CAC/Green Star or three or more

First Prizes at Open and Championship Shows (Minor Puppy, Special Minor Puppy and Special

Puppy classes excepted, whether restricted or not).

GRADUATE

For dogs which have not won a Challenge Certificate/CACIB/CAC/Green Star or four or more
First Prizes at Championship Shows in Graduate, Post Graduate, Minor Limit, Mid Limit, Limit and
Open classes, whether restricted or not where challenge certificates were offered for the breed.

For dogs which have not won a Challenge Certificate/CACIB/CAC/Green Star or five or more First

Prizes at Championship Shows in Post Graduate, Minor Limit, Mid Limit, Limit and Open classes,

whether restricted or not where Challenge Certificates were offered for the breed.

MID LIMIT For dogs which have not become show Champions under Kennel Club Regulations or under the

rules of any governing body recognised by the Kennel Club, or won 3 or more CC/CACIB/ CAC/Green Stars or won 5 or more First Prizes in all at Championship Shows in Mid Limit, Limit and Open Classes confined to the Breed, whether restricted or not at Shows where Challenge

Certificates were offered for the breed.

LIMIT For dogs which have not become show Champions under the Kennel Club Regulations or under

the rules of any governing body recognised by the Kennel Club, or won 3 or more CC/CACIB/CAC/Green Stars or won 7 or more First Prizes in all at Championship Shows in Limit and Open Classes confined to the Breed, whether restricted or not at Shows where Challenge Certificates

were offered for the breed.

For all dogs of the breeds for which the class is provided and eligible for entry at the Show.

SPECIAL VETERAN For all dogs of not less than seven years of age on the day of the Show.

SPECIAL VINTAGE For all dogs of 10 + years of age on the day of the Show.

BRACE For 2 exhibits (either sex or mixed) of the same colour belonging to the same exhibitor, each

exhibit having been entered in some class other than Brace or Team.

PROGENY For a dog or bitch accompanied by at least three of its registered progeny. The dog or bitch not

necessarily entered in another class, however all progeny having been entered and exhibited in another class. The dog or bitch and the progeny need not be registered in the same ownership.

SPECIAL MEMBERS' CLASS As Open but must be fully paid up members of the SCWTC of GB and where a dog is owned in

partnership all exhibitors should be a member of the SCWTC of GB. Dogs must have been

entered in a previous class at the show to be eligible.

SPECIAL BEGINNERS For dog, owner or handler never to have won a Challenge Certificate or a Reserve Challenge

Certificate.

POST GRADUATE

CHAMPION For dogs which have been confirmed a Champion or Show Champion under Kennel Club Regulations

or under the rules of any governing body recognised by the Kennel Club.

NOT FOR COMPETITION Societies may at their discretion, accept Not for Competition entries. Societies may accept such

entries from breeds of dog not included within the title of the Society and at Shows held over more

than one day, such entries may be accepted on any day from any breed.

REGULATIONS FOR THE PREPARATION OF DOGS FOR EXHIBITION F (B)

- These Regulations must be observed when a dog is prepared for exhibition and/or exhibited at any Kennel Club Licensed event. Objections may be referred to the General Committee for disciplinary action under these Show Regulations and/or for disciplinary action under Kennel Club Rule A11.
 - a) A dog found to have been exhibited in breach of these Regulations will automatically be disqualified from exhibition at the show and from any award gained there at.
 - b) Unless the exhibitor provides a satisfactory explanation for the dog being exhibited in breach of these Regulations then he/she may be subject to further penalties of either a fine or as listed under Rule A11.
- a) No substance which alters the natural colour, texture or body of the coat may be present in the dog's coat for any purpose at any time during the show. No substance which alters the natural colour of any external part of the dog may by present on the dog for any purpose at any time during the show.
 - b) Any other substance (other than water) which may be used in the preparation of a dog for exhibition must not be allowed to remain in the coat or on any other part of the dog at the time of exhibition.
- 3. No act or operation which alters the natural conformation of a dog or any part thereof may be performed except:
 - a) Operations certified to the satisfaction of the General Committee.

b) The removal of dew claws of any breed.

c) Operations to prevent breeding provided that such operations are notified to the Kennel Club before neutered dogs are shown.

Nor must anything be done calculated to in the opinion of the General Committee to deceive.

- 4. The General Committee without previous notice may order an examination of any dog or dogs at any Show. Any examination thus ordered will be made by a person having executive authority who shall have a written directive from the Kennel Club in their possession. Samples may be taken for further examination and analysis.
- An individual has the right to lodge an objection to a dog only if he/she is the owner or handler of a dog competing in the same breed or class. An objection may, however, be lodged by an official of the Show or by anyone so deputed by the Kennel Club. It will be the responsibility of the individual who lodges the objection or the official (as appropriate) to substantiate the grounds for the objection. The Kennel Club will substantiate the grounds for an objection made on its behalf.
- 6. Any objection by an individual related to an infringement of these regulations must be made in writing to the Show Secretary at his/her office before the close of the Show & the individual must produce evidence of identity at the time of lodging the complaint.

!! Use of Electrical Equipment at Shows!!

The Kennel Club is becoming increasingly concerned at the amount of electrical equipment being used by exhibitors at shows, including hair dryers and hair straighteners and other grooming devices. Electrical equipment should not be brought to shows unless absolutely necessary. In rare instances where it might be required, it should be PAT tested and permission sought from the secretary of the show before it is used.

SECURITY AT SHOWS

In light of recent events the Kennel Club would like to issue a reminder to all societies of the importance of security at dog shows. The Kennel Club understand that due to the nature of dog shows and the quantity of paraphernalia exhibitors bring, it would be extremely difficult for show organisers to take on the issue of security alone, therefore we would re-iterate the advice being given by the Police and security services, that everyone in the UK should remain vigilant and this applies to those organising and taking part in dog shows.

The importance of exhibitors feeling that they and their dogs are safe when attending a show cannot be underestimated. We would therefore remind you of the importance of the need for show organisers and exhibitors to remain mindful of potential dangers and that all visitors to shows generally need to be vigilant and alert. Furthermore the society provide robust notification informing exhibitors of where to report to should they see anything suspicious or of concern, and the evacuation procedures in place.

In view of the above, should you see anything suspicious or of concern, please alert the Show Manager, and/or the Show Secretary immediately. If it is a package or bag you are concerned about, please do NOT attempt to move it or examine it yourself.

Should it be necessary for the hall to be evacuated, please remember that evacuation should be carried out as speedily but as safely as possible, as in the case of a fire. It is important that you do not block the exit routes with cages or bags. Please follow any instructions given to you by the Show Management regarding evacuation procedures.

RULES AND REGULATIONS

- 1. The show will open at 9.00 a.m.
- Dogs will be received at any time but it is the exhibitor's responsibility to ensure that dogs are available for judging when
 required
- 3. Judging will commence at 10.00 a.m.
- 4. Exhibits may be removed from the Show after their judging has been completed. The Show will close half an hour after all judging has been completed.
- 5. ENTRY FEES: Members 1st Entry £18.00 per dog. Non -members 1st Entry £20.00 per dog. Subsequent entries £1.00 per class. (EXCEPT STAKES CLASS) Brace counts as a single entry. Not for Competition £1.00 per dog. Vintage classes are FREE. Junior Handling £1.00. Junior Handler of the is FREE. Catalogues £2.00 (pre-paid) (£2.50 on the day)
- Prize Money. The amount of prize money at the Show is £25 for the winner of the Special Beginners Stakes.
- The Committee reserves to itself the right to refuse entries.
- 8. Puppies under six calendar months of age on the first day of the show are not eligible for exhibition.
- The mating of bitches within the precincts of the show is forbidden.
- 10. Best Puppy in Show Where a Best puppy in Show competition is scheduled the Best Puppy in Show is a puppy which has competed and received a first prize in a class as the same show. A Puppy is a dog of six and not exceeding twelve calendar months of age on the first day of the Show. Where the Best in Show is a puppy it may at the discretion of the judge be awarded Best Puppy in Show respectively. Similarly, if the Reserve Best in Show is a puppy which has only been beaten by an adult dog it may, at the discretion of the judge be Best Puppy in Show respectively. Consequently, selection of Best Puppy in Show must follow the selection of Best in Show respectively.
- 11. Best in Show Best in Show must be selected from the exhibits declared Best of Sex. If a Reserve Best in Show is to be selected, the eligible dogs are those declared Best Opposite Sex and the Reserve Best of Sex to the exhibit declared Best Opposite Sex and the Reserve Best in Show and Reserve Best in Show must not compete in any subsequent competition.
- 12. Exhibits will not be admitted to Best in Show competition after a period of ten minutes has elapsed since the announcement that exhibits are required for judging, unless they have been unavoidably delayed by previous judging not being completed on time, and then only with permission of the Show Management.
- 13. Exhibitors must not pick up dogs by their tails and leads when lifting them nor handle a dog in a manner which causes its feet not to touch the ground when on the move. This is not acceptable. Exhibitors should note that such practice would constitute harsh handling and reports of such practice will be referred to the Committee under Kennel Club Show Regulations F11.
- All exhibitors must be familiar with Kennel Club Regulation F (Annex B) Regulations for the Preparation of Dogs for Exhibition
- 15. All dogs resident outside the UK must be issued with a Kennel Club Authority to Compete number before entry to the show/event can be made. All overseas entries without an Authority to Compete number will be returned to the exhibitor/ competitor.
- 16. DOĠS IN VEHICLES ON HOT DAYS. Anyone whose dog is entered at a Kennel Club licensed event should take all reasonable steps to ensure the needs of their dog(s) are met, and should not put a dog's health and welfare at risk by any action, default, omission or otherwise. Breach of Kennel Club Regulations in this respect may be referred to the General Committee for action under Kennel Club Rules and Regulations.

Your dog is vulnerable and at risk during hot weather and the Kennel Club offers the following guidance to help guide you through the do's and don'ts travelling to and whilst at KC licenced events.

When travelling to a show please take a moment to consider whether the route to the show is on a busy holiday route, and leave earlier to avoid increased time in traffic jams.

If your vehicle is not air-conditioned seriously consider whether travelling to the show is a good idea at all.

The vehicle should be as fully ventilated as possible, and plenty of stops should be taken, with lots of water available to drink.

Ensure your dog is not sitting in full sunlight. There should be plenty of free flowing air around the dog. When at the show, never leave your dog in the vehicle.

Keep the dog in the shade – take your own shade for example a large umbrella and always have plenty of water available to drink so your dog stays well hydrated.

Avoid your dog taking part in unnecessary exertion, or from standing in exposed sunlight for extended lengths of time. Remember, if you feel hot your dog is very likely to feel much hotter and dehydrated, and this could lead to dire results. Please look after your dog's welfare.

- Anyone whose dog is entered at a Kennel Club licensed event should take all reasonable steps to ensure the needs of their dog(s) are met, and should not put a dog's health and welfare at rise by any action, default omission or otherwise. Breach of Kennel Club Regulations in this respect may be referred to the Board for disciplinary action under the Kennel club Rules and Regulations. The use of pinch collars, electronic shock collars, or prong collars, is not permitted at any show licensed by the Kennel Club. This shall apply at the venue or within the precincts of the show.
- Not for competition entries will be accepted. Details of each dog so entered must be recorded on the entry form and must be Kennel Club registered.
- No modifications will be made to this schedule except by permission of the Board of the Kennel Club, which will be followed by advertisement in the Canine Press wherever possible.

- 20. Dog Fouling and Grooming: Any owner exhibitor handler or person in charge of a dog is required to remove, as soon as possible, any fouling caused by their dog(s) at any Kennel Club licensed show within the licensed venue and within the environs of that event, including car parks and approaches. Any organization holding a Kennel Club Licensed event is required to provide an adequate number of receptacles for the disposal of such fouling.
- 21. Exhibitors passes will not be sent out. Please send a SAE. If you wish for acknowledgement of entries.
- 22. Responsibility. The Committee will not be responsible for the loss, detention of, or damage to any dog or other property whether arising from accident, or other cause whatever, or from any act of omission of itself, its officers, agents, servants or other, or damage done by the exhibitors to any person or property.
- The owner, exhibitor, handler or other person in charge of a dog at Kennel Club linenced events, must at all times ensure that the dog is kept under proper control whilst at the licenced venue, including its environs, car and caravan parks and approaches. This Regulation applies before (at any time during the set up period at the venue) during the event and afterwards (at any time during the breakdown of the event).

SPOT LIGHT ON THE JUDGE

Mr Graham Dowdy (Denzilly)

My initial attraction to the soft coated wheaten terrier commenced in 1994 when Jo and I visited Discover Dogs at Crufts and an undeniably gorgeous blonde terrier jumped up on a bench & peered over at us exuberantly wagging his tail. Jo turned to me instantly and uttered the words "I don't know what it is but that is the breed for us," it was love at first sight; those words were to have an enormous impact on our lives. The dog we fell in love with was Ch Berkley Brockbuster.



In May 1994, our first wheaten Denzil (Miwaivlys Bachuss) joined us as a pet. Like the majority of wheaten owners showing was never our intention however a club committee member persuaded us to "have a go" and at his first show, which by coincidence was the SCWT Club Of GB Championship Show, he qualified for Crufts and the show bug had bitten. After learning the ropes of handling, I decided to turn my hand to stewarding initially at open shows progressing to championship shows as I gained experience. After stewarding for many of the UK's top judges over the years I was inspired to undertake the necessary courses to enable me to judge and my first appointment was at Liverpool Sporting Terrier in 1999. To date I have awarded five sets of Challenge Certificates in the breed, having awarded my first CCs at Midland Counties Canine Society in 2012.

Over the years I have shared my life with nine wheatens and currently have four at home. I also enjoy breeding the occasional litter under the Denzilly affix.

I would like to take this opportunity to thank the members of the SCWT Club Of GB who voted for me to judge their 2022 Championship Show, a great honour indeed, and I am very much looking forward to judging on the day.

Spotlight on Specials judge Mr David Shields (Wilholme)

I first started showing dogs in 1971, Cocker Spaniels and then in the 1980's Border Terriers. Over the years there have been many Show Champions and CC winners bred and owned under the 'Wilholme' prefix, firstly the Cockers and also along with my partner Irene Glen, German Shorthaired Pointers from the 2000's, including Sh.Ch.Wilholme Chasing The Dream, winner of the Bitch CC at Crufts in 2010 and 2011 and most recently her granddaughter Sh.Ch./Ir.Sh.Ch.Wilholme Sharp 'n' Smart at Bessalone who won the CC at Crufts this year.
