SPOTLIGHT ON YOUR JUDGE

Mark Ord (Marnadee)

Have spent the last 45 years involved with show dogs and dog shows in a variety of different roles from exhibitor, breeder, committee member, officer, steward and judge.

I started in dogs with Border Terriers in 1975 and shortly after in Afghan Hounds, these I consider my main breeds but it was my Afghans I concentrated on as I was more successful with those and never in a position to have many dogs myself. I came from a non-doggy family and persuading them to have a dog was difficult enough but then when the bug bites and you want another then another it takes over your life. But I would not have changed it for the world and 45 years later I am still addicted to the dog game.

I have made up and bred Champion Afghans in a time when entries were huge in the breed and I am sure enthusiasts will understand what I mean when I say breeds are in and out of fashion. We could have entries of 3-400 at a Championship Show and now we are lucky if they are in the 60-70 range.

Now in a position in life where it is difficult to keep dogs myself now because of personal commitments I was persuaded by respected peers not to leave the dog game but to branch out and judge more breeds, which is what I am now doing and I thoroughly enjoy this. Because I have owned, bred and shown Hounds and Terriers that is the only breeds I wish to judge as I feel comfortable doing this and have no desire to judge all breeds. I only have one dog to show at present a Standard W/H Dachshund.

I will judge all Hounds and Terriers at Championship and Open Show level. I also judge Dalmatians as I have a particular interest in the breed and in many countries they are actually in the Hound Group. I currently am passed by KC to judge 9 Hound and 10 Terrier breeds at Championship level and the KC have approved appointments for my first Championship Show Groups in 2024, for both the Hound and Terrier Groups.

I am looking forward to judging at your Club Open Show in 2024 and feel very honoured and privileged to have been given this opportunity. I look forward to my day with you all and hope you will support me. You will receive an honest opinion on the dogs on the day.

PHOTOGRAPHY & VIDEO RIGHTS

The Organisers would like to bring the regulation on photography, filming & live streaming to the attention of exhibitors, trade stands, press and visitors. It is a condition of all those attending the event that no filming or other form or recording may be taken or made at the venue without the express written permission of the organisers. The taking of photographs in the venue for sale or reward is strictly prohibited except with the written permission of the Organisers. Press accredited photographers are provided with permission to take photographs ONLY for the use in newspapers, magazines and internet sites — this is for news purposes only. There is no objection to the general public taking photographs or video film of general views of the show, provided these are for private use only. Specific dogs may be photographed only with the approval of the exhibitor.

No photography, filming or live streaming is permitted in breed judging rings whilst judging is actually taking place. However, judges may allow it to happen at the end of the classes. Filming and flash photography is allowed from outside the rings at all times unless the operation of the camera is actually affecting the exhibits. However, if a powerful flash unit is used or it is clear that exhibitors are being affected a ring steward or judge is empowered to stop the person concerned. Cinematography or television equipment may only be used at the show if a permit has been issued by the Organisers.

DEFINITIONS OF CLASSES

(N.B. The word 'dog' includes both sexes)

In the following definitions, a Challenge Certificate includes any Show award that counts towards the title of Champion under the rules of any governing body recognised by the Kennel Club. Wins at Championship Shows in breed classes where Challenge Certificates are not on offer shall be counted as wins at Open Shows. In the case of a dog owned in partnership and entered in Members' classes or competing for Members' Specials each partner must at the time of entry be a member of the Society. In estimating the number of awards won, all wins up to and including the seventh day before the first closing date shall be counted when entering for any class i.e. **Saturday, 8th June 2024**.

Wins in Variety classes do not count for entry in breed classes but when entering for Variety classes, wins in both Breed and Variety classes must be counted. First prizes awarded in any classes defined as Special do not count towards eligibility. If an exhibitor reports before the judging of a class or classes that a dog has been entered which is ineligible, the exhibitor may choose one of the following options:-

- (1) Withdrawal
 - The dog may be withdrawn from competition subject to the conditions of Regulation F.(1).19.
- (2) Transfer
 - a) If a dog is ineligible for a class or classes as regards its colour, sex, weight or height the Show Secretary shall transfer it to the equivalent class or classes for the correct colour, sex, weight or height and, in the event of there being no equivalent class, Minor Puppy and Puppy excepted to the Open class for the correct colour, sex, weight or height.
 - b) For an exhibit entered incorrectly in a Minor Puppy Class, Puppy Class or Junior Class, which is over age but under twelve calendar months of age, eighteen calendar months of age or 24 calendar months of age respectively, the Show Secretary shall transfer the exhibit to the Puppy Class, Junior Class or Yearling Class respectively for the correct colour, sex, weight or height and in the event of there being no Puppy, Junior or Yearling Class to the Open Class for the correct colour, sex, weight or height.
 - c) For any reason other than the above, the Show Secretary shall transfer it to the Open Class for the correct colour, sex, weight or height.
 - d) If an exhibit arrives late and misses a class, even if it is the only class in which the dog is entered, the dog may not be transferred to any other class.

BABY PUPPY A baby puppy is a dog of four and less than six calendar months of age on the first day of the Show.

PUPPY For dogs of six and not exceeding twelve calendar months of age on the first day of the Show.

JUNIOR For dogs of six and not exceeding eighteen calendar months of age on the first day of the Show.

- **POST GRADUATE** For dogs which have not won a Challenge Certificate/CACIB/CAC/Green Star or five or more First Prizes at Championship Shows in Post Graduate, Minor Limit, Mid Limit, Limit and Open classes, whether restricted or not where Challenge Certificates were offered for the breed.
- LIMIT For dogs which have not become show Champions under the Kennel Club Regulations or under the rules of any governing body recognised by the Kennel Club, or won 3 or more CC/CACIB/CAC/Green Stars or won 7 or more First Prizes in all at Championship Shows in Limit or Open Classes confined to the Breed, whether restricted or not at Shows where Challenge Certificates were offered for the breed.
- **OPEN** For all dogs of the breeds for which the class is provided and eligible for entry at the Show.
- VETERAN For dogs of not less than seven years of age on the first day of the Show.

SPECIAL BEGINNERS For a dog, owner or handler having never won a Challenge Certificate or a Reserve Challenge Certificate.

- **PROGENY** For a dog or bitch, accompanied by at least three of its registered progeny. The dog or bitch not necessarily entered in another class however, all progeny having been entered and exhibited in another class. The dog or bitch and the progeny need not be registered in the same ownership.
- **BRACE** For two exhibits (either sex or mixed) of one breed belonging to the same exhibitor, each exhibit having been entered in some class other than Brace or Team.

ADVISORY NOTICE

NOT FOR COMPETITION Societies may at their discretion, accept Not for Competition entries. Societies may accept such entries from breeds of dog not included within the title of the Society and at Shows held over more than one day, such entries may be accepted on any day from any breed.

RULES and REGULATIONS

- 1. The Show will open at 9.30 am.
- 2. Dogs will be received at any time after the opening of the show but it is the exhibitor's responsibility to ensure that dogs are available for judging when required.
- 3. Judging will commence at 10.30 am.
- 4. Exhibits may be removed from the Show after their judging has been completed. The show will close half an hour after all judging has been completed.
- 5. Entry Fees: Members: First Entry per dog £6.00; each subsequent entry with same dog £1.00. Non-Members: First entry per dog £7.00; each subsequent entry with same dog £1.00. Baby Puppy Classes: £3.00 per dog. Junior Handling: £1.00 per class. Not for Competition: £1.00 per dog. Catalogues: £2.00 pre-paid with entries (£2.50 on the day). Catalogue Adverts: £10.00 Full Page (additional £5.00 for B/W Photograph); £5.00 Half Page (text only). Rosette Donations: £3.00 per class.

- 6. There is no Prize Money on offer at this Show.
- 7. The Committee reserves to itself the right to refuse entries.
- 8. Puppies under four calendar months of age on the first day of the Show are not eligible for exhibition.
- 9. The mating of bitches within the precincts of the Show is forbidden.
- 10. Best Puppy in Show: Where a Best Puppy in Show competition is scheduled the Best Puppy in Show is a puppy which has competed and is unbeaten by any other puppy exhibited at the same show. A puppy is a dog of six and not exceeding twelve calendar months of age on the first day of the Show. Where the Best in Show is a puppy it may, at the discretion of the judge, be awarded Best Puppy in Show. Where the Reserve Best in Show is a puppy which has only been beaten by an adult dog it may, at the discretion of the judge, be awarded Best Puppy in Show. Where the Reserve Best in Show is a puppy which has only been beaten by an adult dog it may, at the discretion of the judge, be Best Puppy in Show. Consequently, selection of Best Puppy in Show must follow the selection of Best in Show.

A Baby Puppy is a dog of four and less than six calendar months of age on the first day of the show. Baby Puppy classes may be scheduled at any breed club show. Any Variety Baby Puppy classes may be scheduled at any breed club show. Best Baby Puppy in Breed may be declared in each breed from the dogs entered in the Baby Puppy breed classes. There must be no progression to further competition.

- 11. Best in Show: Best in Show must be selected from the exhibits declared Best of Sex. If a Reserve Best in Show is to be selected, the eligible dogs are those declared Best Opposite Sex and Reserve Best of Sex to the exhibit declared Best in Show.
- 12. Exhibits will not be admitted to Best in Show competition after a period of ten minutes has elapsed since the announcement that exhibits are required for judging, unless they have been unavoidably delayed by previous judging not being completed on time, and then only with the special permission of the Show Management.
- 13. Exhibitors must not pick up dogs by their tails and leads when lifting them <u>nor handle a dog in a manner which causes</u> its feet not to touch the ground when on the move. This is not acceptable. Exhibitors should note that such practice would constitute harsh handling and reports of such practice will be referred to the Committee under Kennel Club Show Regulation F11.
- 14. All exhibitors must be familiar with Kennel Club Regulation F (Annex B) Regulations for the Preparation of Dogs for Exhibition.
- 15. All dogs resident outside of the UK must be issued with a Kennel Club Authority to Compete number before entry to the show/event can be made. All overseas entries without an Authority to Compete number will be returned to the exhibitor/competitor.
- 16. **Dogs in Vehicles on Hot Days.** Your dog is vulnerable and at risk during hot weather and the Kennel Club offers the following guidance to help guide you through the do's and don'ts travelling to and whilst at KC licensed events.
 - When travelling to a show please take a moment to consider whether the route to the show is on a busy holiday route, and leave earlier to avoid increased time in traffic jams.
 - · If your vehicle is not air-conditioned seriously consider whether travelling to the show is a good idea at all.
 - The vehicle should be as fully ventilated as possible, and plenty of stops should be taken, with lots of water available to drink.
 - Ensure your dog is not sitting in full sunlight. There should be plenty of free flowing air around the dog.
 - When at the show, never leave your dog in the vehicle.
 - Keep the dog in the shade take your own shade for example a large umbrella and always have plenty of water available to drink so your dog stays well hydrated.
 - Avoid your dog taking part in unnecessary exertion, or from standing in exposed sunlight for extended lengths of time.

Remember, if you feel hot your dog is very likely to feel much hotter and dehydrated, and this could lead to dire results. Please look after your dog's welfare. WARNING: IF YOUR DOG IS FOUND TO BE AT RISK FORCIBLE ENTRY TO YOUR VEHICLE MAY BE NECESSARY WITHOUT LIABILITY FOR ANY DAMAGE CAUSED.

- 17. Anyone whose dog is entered at a Kennel Club licensed event should take all reasonable steps to ensure the needs of their dog(s) are met, and should not put a dog's health and welfare at risk by any action, default, omission or otherwise. Breach of Kennel Club Regulations in this respect may be referred to the Board for disciplinary action under the Kennel Club Rules and Regulations. The use of pinch collars, electronic shock collars, or prong collars, is not permitted at any show licensed by the Kennel Club. This shall apply at the venue or within the precincts of the show.
- Not for Competition entries will be accepted. Details of each dog so entered must be recorded on the entry form and must be Kennel Club registered.
- No modifications will be made to this Schedule except by permission of the Board of the Kennel Club, which will be followed by advertisement in the Canine Press wherever possible.
- 20. Any owner, competitor, handler or other person in charge of a dog is required to remove as soon as possible any fouling caused by their dog(s) at any Kennel Club licensed show within the licensed venue and within the environs of that event including car and caravan parks and approaches.
- 21. Exhibitor passes will not be sent out. Please send an SAE if you require acknowledgement of entries.
- 22. The Committee will do its utmost to ensure the safety of the dogs brought for exhibition but it must be clearly understood by exhibitors and all other persons at the show that the Committee will not be responsible for the loss or damage to any dogs or property, or personal injury whether arising from accident or any other cause whatsoever
- 23. The owner, exhibitor, handler or other person in charge of a dog at a Kennel Club licensed event must at all times ensure that the dog is kept under proper control whilst at the licensed venue, including its environs, car and caravan parks and approaches. This regulation applies before (at any time during the set up period at the venue), during the event and afterwards (at any time during the breakdown of the event).
- 24. Every exhibitor shall ensure that whilst the dog is being exhibited, its handler shall display the correct ring number.

HOW TO FIND THE VENUE

STEVENTON VILLAGE HALL Steventon, Oxon OX13 6RR

Leave the A34 at Milton Interchange and turn west towards Wantage. After $\frac{1}{2}$ mile turn right at traffic lights to Steventon. The venue is $\frac{1}{2}$ mile on your right on the village green.

Exhibitors travelling from the M4 onto the A34, do not take the first exit to Wantage but continue to the next exit which is the Milton Interchange and Steventon is signposted (A4130).

IMPORTANT NOTICES

FOULING: FOULING MUST BE CLEANED UP ANYWHERE IN THE VENUE, INCLUDING THE CAR PARK AND GRASSED AREA.

EXERCISE AREA: An exercise area is provided and it is the responsibility of the Exhibitors/ Handlers to clean up any fouling caused by dogs in their charge. Equipment is provided for the purpose and your cooperation would be appreciated.

DOGS IN VEHICLES ON HOT DAYS: Your dog is vulnerable and AT RISK if left in a vehicle in high temperatures and even on days considered as slightly warm. Please take care of your dog. If your dog is found to be at risk forcible entry to your vehicle may be necessary without liability for any damage caused.

CHILDREN: The Committee reminds exhibitors bringing children to the show that they will be held responsible for their behaviour at all times and for any damage to property or equipment within the environs of the Showground caused by their children or children in their care.

PUPPIES: Puppies under 4 months of age on the day of the show may not be entered for competition.

PLEASE NOTE: It is the exhibitor's responsibility to be at their class for judging.

SALE OF GOODS: Sale of goods other than those on the Club Bookstall must be cleared with the Committee beforehand.

SOFT CRATES: The Kennel Club has asked that we draw your attention to the potential health and safety implications concerning the use of soft crates as in its view, they do not offer sufficient protection to dogs. They have asked that we point out that dogs should not be left unattended in soft crates. There have been instances where dogs have escaped from soft crates which have not been securely fastened to benches, or that have been left at ringside.

We therefore ask that if you use soft crates, you do not leave the dogs unattended, either in the hall, or in an open car in the car park.
